If you lease - do you need your landlords permission?

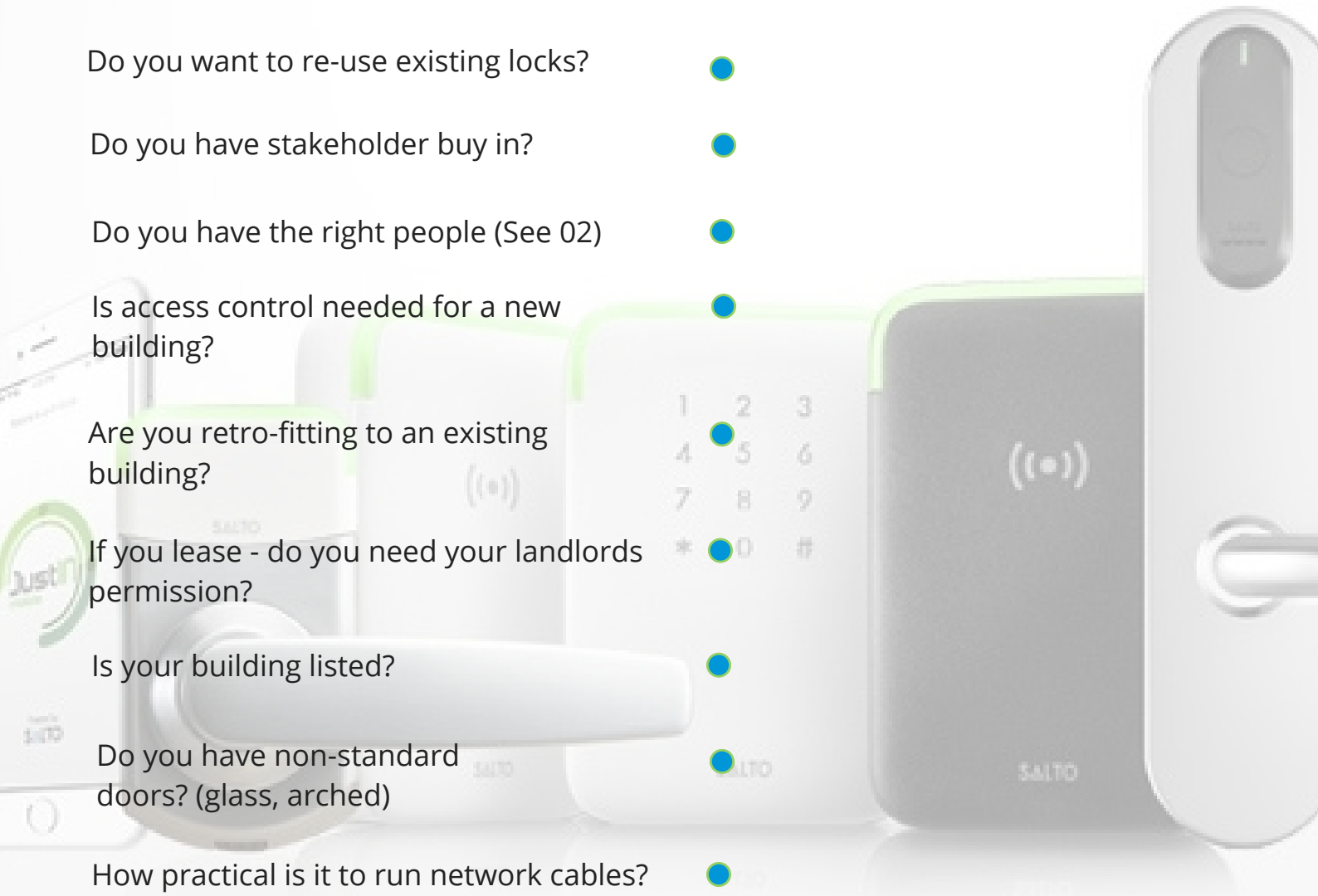
Is your building listed?

04 WALK YOUR BUILDING

Now's the time to get your practical head on - walking your building helps you identify how many doors, which are essential, what internal doors you want to secure.. Don't forget the outside, what about your perimeter or carparks?

How many external doors do you have? ●

Do all these need securing? ●

What about your perimeter - do you have gates, fences or entrance barriers? ●

Do you want to control your car park? ●

Do you have outdoor storage areas that need to be locked? ●

Inside, do you have sensitive areas - such as server rooms, research labs, or other areas where confidential information is stored? ●

What about lifts or turnstiles? ●

How will staff identify themselves at a door?
Do you already use ID cards? Do you want to use these for your access control solution? ●

Would you consider using your team's mobile phones as their 'key'? ●
